Observe the change in the average number of years by which the life expectancy of whites in Chicago is greater than the life expectancy of blacks in Chicago	Data from vital statistics and census collections
4	Has there been a positive trend in the supply of quality healthcare services for vulnerable populations and underserved areas?	Health services and facilities increase in locations with high disparity health levels	The data collected from healthcare institutions, surveys of the community members.

Increase of wellness community-led programs and initiatives in neighborhoods with underserved populations.	Data involving the community organizations' information, community members' surveys, and the city health department's records.
10	How has the concept of healthcare and the availability of healthcare services in underserved community's added value to Healthy Chicago 2025 since its implementation?	Understand members of the community about their health conditions and the availability of health care services.
