INPUTS

- Making use of health data to rank buildings for proactive healthy homes inspections.
- Applying housing resource allocation health criteria.
- Offer resource and support for community member by focusing on youth to public safety initiative.



ACTIVITIES

- Reduce health hazards in the home environment
- Assess the city's transportation needs and the potential impact of the community
- Engage with local stakeholders to gather input and gauge support for the program
- Increase availability of affordable and supportive housing
- Analyze potential funding models and their implications for the city's budget and resources



OUTPUT

- Embed health equity measures and strategies
- Applying findings to decision-making
- Physical improvements the neighborhood spaces
