

**AFR 140 Exam II in two parts:** Students will submit parts one and two in the same document. Students will submit in Word doc or pdf file.

Part 1. Consists of the normal exam on concepts and reading.

Part 2. Comes after the first part in the same document.

Part 2 consists of an Outline for the Final Paper, which is single spaced, 12 pt times new roman, 1 inch margins left and right, with two sources at the end that are specifically related to your topic in APA alphabetical order, by last name of the author or title if no author.

This part is worth 20 pts See example below. It is just a guide. You do not have to do it exactly this way. But provide an outline that thoroughly reflects your project, how you will approach it. (You can also go on line to see examples for writing research papers or formal essay.) Caution do not hand in a rough draft of a paper. Even if this is hard for you, give it a try. You will get credit. I cannot give credit if there is no outline to grade. Use your proposal as a guide

**Title: The Impact of The Civil Rights Freedom Riders Movement on Africana Thought and Action.**

I. Introduction

Thesis: the opening statement and/or thesis goes here. This should come from your proposal. Example: Several important activists had great impact on the Civil Rights Movement as Freedom Riders. The courageous efforts, tactics, and writings of people like John Lewis and Diane Nash serve as lasting outstanding examples of this impact.

a. Describe the context, define your terms; for example what is a Freedom Rider.

(Use full sentences)

b. Provide sub-questions or themes. List what you are looking at within this context, type of sources or perspectives (where applicable for you).

c. Consider: Anything relevant to how you are approaching your research

II. The Body of the Paper (main points or themes you will discuss) This part indicates how the paper is structured)

a. A topic sentence: It indicates how you will start the body of the paper. For example the background of the movement, historical context and list main points.

b. Sentence that reflects the next theme or section of the paper, main points

c. Sentence that reflects the next theme or section of the paper, main points

III. The Conclusion (or potential findings)

a. What you expect your analysis to lead to

b. Summary of finding, of others and yours

c. Perhaps, how all this might relate to today? OR Why there needs to be more research in this area.

Required: At least two sources go herein alphabetical order, written in APAformat for a Works Cited page, titles correctly written, publishers and so forth.
