

DATASET

1. Please watch the Tutorial Video for instructions.
2. Import the Dataset (in .xlsx format) into StatsCloud.

The following information was collected from a sample of students in Class.

ID: Assigned participant ID

Empathetic Listening Scale: 5-point Likert scale (1 – Never, 5 – Always)

Subscale 1 - Sensing

1. I am sensitive to what others are not saying.
2. I am aware of what others imply but do not say.
3. I understand how others feel.
4. I listen for more than just the spoken words.

Subscale 2 - Processing

5. I assure others that I will remember what they say.
6. I summarize points of agreement and disagreement when appropriate.
7. I keep track of points others make.

Subscale 3 - Responding

8. I assure others that I am listening by using verbal acknowledgments.
9. I assure others that I am receptive to their ideas.
10. I ask questions that show my understanding of others' positions.
11. I show others that I am listening by my body language (e.g., head nods).

Scoring: Calculate an average for each subscale (Sensing, Processing, and Responding) to represent students' overall score on sensing, processing, and responding.

Relationship Closeness Scale: 7-point Likert scale (1 – Disagree, 7 – Agree)

1. My relationship with my best friend is close.
2. When we are apart, I do not miss my best friend a great deal.*
3. My best friend and I disclose important personal things to each other.
4. My best friend and I have a strong connection.
5. My best friend and I want to spend time together.
6. I'm sure of my relationship with my best friend.
7. My best friend is a priority in my life.

8. My best friend and I do not do a lot of things together.*
9. When I have free time, I choose to spend it alone with my best friend.
10. I think about my best friend a lot.
11. My relationship with my best friend is important in my life.
12. I do not consider my best friend when making important decisions.*

Scoring: *Recode variables. Calculate 1 mean score with all 12 items to represent overall relationship closeness.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Calculate the internal consistency (Cronbach's alpha) for each subscale in the measures above (Empathetic Listening Scale and Relationship Closeness Scale). If the measures do not include subscales, calculate one internal consistency for all of the items.
2. Score the measures based on the instructions for that particular measure. Make sure you do not include any problematic items based on the results of your internal consistency analyses when you calculate your new variable(s).
3. Calculate the mean and standard deviation of each subscale/scale in the Empathetic Listening Scale and the Relationship Closeness Scale.
4. Write two APA-Style measures sections: (1) the Empathetic Listening Scale, and (2) the Relationship Closeness Scale.
 - a. Must include: the in-text reference, a description of what the scale measures, details of what it includes (items, scale, scoring, interpretation), internal consistency (alpha), and descriptive statistics of any new variables created.
5. **Separate Task:** In this paper on humour in the classroom, what scale/instrument was used to assess working memory overload and coherence in Study 1?
