Blackboard Discussions

Class Attendance

- ❖ **Full attendance means answer the assigned questions, on the weekly bases, by Saturday at 11:59PM and comment on at least three of your classmates' posts by Monday at 11:59PM.** All students are responsible for the material covered in each assignment in addition to the material posted on Blackboard to enhance the class learning (i.e. articles and videos).
- ❖ It is impossible to earn a respectable grade without logging to Blackboard regularly and reading all the assignments and being engaged with classmates. Please note 10% of the exam questions will be from the additional assigned reading and videos outside the textbook. If you don't complete the additional assignments, you risk forfeiting 10% of your grade.

- ❖ Please note that three absences (by way of not participating in Blackboard discussions) will lead to reducing your final grade by 5 points. This will mean if your final grade is 'A-', three absences will reduce that grade by 5 points to 'B+'.
- ❖ For absence due to sickness, students MUST present proof of medical emergencies.

Class Participation

- ❖ Blackboard participation is critical to your learning process. Class participation will improve your communication skills, enhance your ability to analyze complex issues and help develop skills that will facilitate you becoming an active leader in the community and in your chosen profession.
- ❖ Historically in this course, Bus 357, participating students in class discussions based on the assigned reading, tend to earn a grade of B+ or better in their final grades. I highly encourage you to stay ahead of your reading assignments. This course has sizable 14 chapters. If you skip your reading for one week, it is very hard to catch up.

All assignments must be submitted on Blackboard in their respective tabs. No attachments are allowed. If you upload a word document or a pdf, it will not be graded. Every assignment has a due date. **If you miss the deadline, you miss the grade for the assignment unless otherwise stated.** In case of emergencies, please provide the instructor with necessary documentation.
