1. Define your research question.
2. Professional background, theoretical approach.
3. Your research field (map and a small walk through the neighborhood)
4. How to do quantitative with this question. (What will you count?)
5. How to do qualitatively with this question. (What will you observe?)

use at least 5 academic articles related to your professional field that also relate to your research question. They should be sources you have either used in previous courses b. sources from the online web and academic search engines that are academic in nature. (simple blogs, newspaper articles, opinion pieces do not suffice).

Annotated Bibliography (written form in APA format, as presented in class and sample)Based on a theoretical stream that relates to your social question and research field, annotate five journal articles, with each annotation including. brief summary of the article

b. how this relates to your specific theoretical stream

Each student will complete a Final Research Paper that includes all the elements of the research project including:

- Research Field
- Research Question/Hypothesis
- Key points of Literature Review
- Quantitative Methodology and Results
- Qualitative Methodology and Results
- Implications and Recommendations.

It will include an APA standard title page, abstract, key words, and bibliography. 3rd person tense, academic prose, double-spaced, 12 pt Times New Roman font. citing sources according to APA standard. If you are unfamiliar with the APA standard, the Purdue OWL is recommended.

It will include an Appendix that contains: Informed Consent, Quantitative Charts, Survey Questions, Map of Research Field, Cinematic Montage (if appropriate), Field Note, Chart of Ethnographic Episodes and timeline

Final Paper should be 11-12 pages
