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**Question (a).**

**Question(c).**

Other professions where unintentional error have a bigger consequences include construction and structure, agrochemical and the police department discipline. Based on construction and structure, an error can lead to the collapse of the building. This can result to huge losses. First there will be losses of lives to the residents of that building. Again there will be damage of property facilitating poverty. This will have a dire significance to the contractor. Similarly, the agrochemicals industries, any error during process can lead to a greater impact. First, it destroys the vegetation and in case of any pollution in
